UNDERSTANDING THIS MAP
 Wider lines indicate greater frequency. Darker lines indicate an overlap of different routes and services along a corridor. This means the widest and darkest lines (such as ML King – Fulton Industrial) have both high frequency and high variety of service. Lines that are wide but light in color (such as Buford Highway or Campbellton Road) have high frequency on a single route, and lines that are narrow and light (such as throughout Southeast Atlanta) have more limited frequency on a single route.
